Responsible for the readiness of over 170 signal systems and all ancillary equipment to include non-standard state of art commercial off-the-shelf technologies, 460 vehicles, 600 TMDE items, and 175 pieces of power generation equipment. Manages, approves, and executes the brigade's operating budget of more than \$1.5M. Supervises and mentors five officers and six noncommissioned officers in the conduct of all logistical support and readiness matters in support of the brigade.

Battalion Security/Operations Officer of the Army's only active duty Petroleum Pipeline Terminal Operating Battalion consisting of 89 Soldiers, 116 Local Japanese Employees and 8 DAC/Wage Grade civilians in support of US Forces and DoD activities on Okinawa Japan. Responsible for ensuring the battalion is prepared for transition from a peacetime to wartime structure. Has primary responsibility for internal operations, training intelligence, force protection, and military education activities and physical security of a \$75M fixed bulk petroleum distribution system. Coordinates, evaluates and advise Battalion Commander on the Battalion's Training program. Responsible for all Battalion OPORDs, OPLANs, Annual/Quarterly Training Guidance, and SOP's. Manage planning in support of joint, combined operations and all bilateral exercises. Focus on Balikatan 09, Orient Shield, and Yamasakura.
