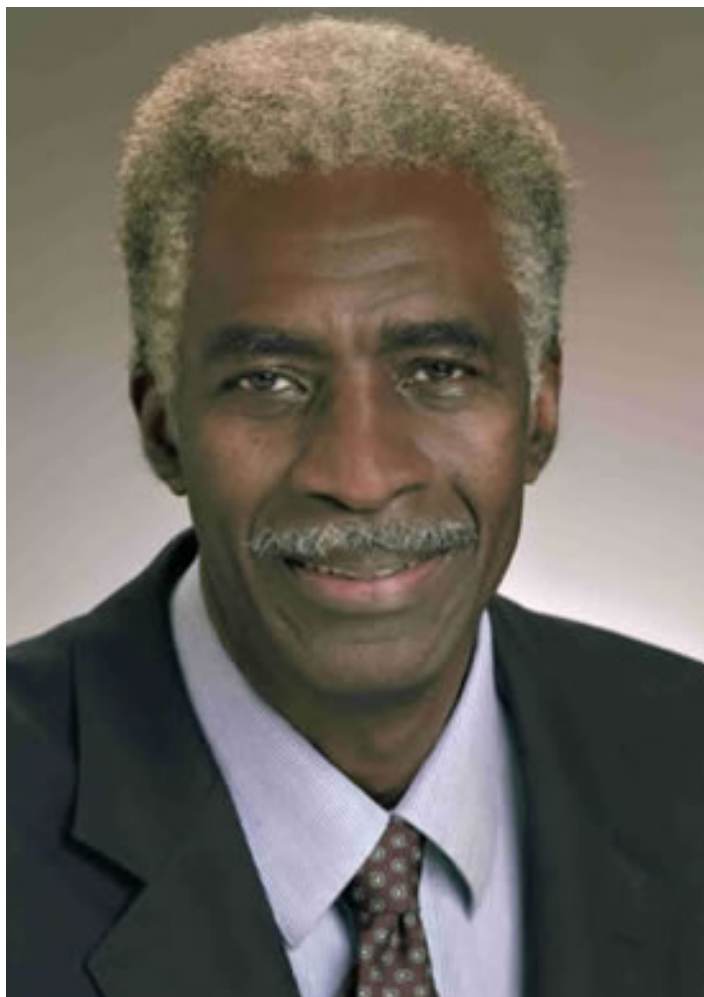

**Gullah Scholar Dr. Emory S. Campbell**

Dr. Emory S. Campbell is the Executive Director of South Carolina's Penn Center and renowned scholar of Gullah communal affairs. Born and raised in Hilton Head, South Carolina, Dr. Campbell's roots are in environmental engineering and community activism. During the 1980s he led the movement to reestablish the connection between Gullah Island residents and Sierra Leone communities. He is the recipient of multiple honors, including 2005's Carter G. Woodson Award from the NEA. Last year was empowered by congress to serve as Chairman of the Gullah-Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor Commission. This month the gallery will host a Gullah cuisine event while Dr. Campbell provides context to the community spotlighted in this photographs. **All are welcomed to attend this program.**
