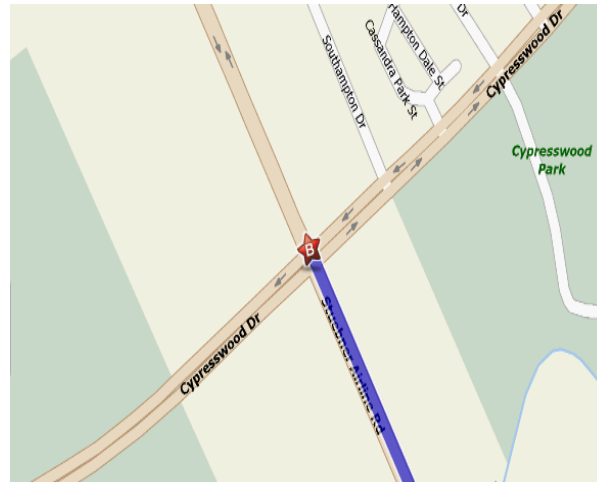
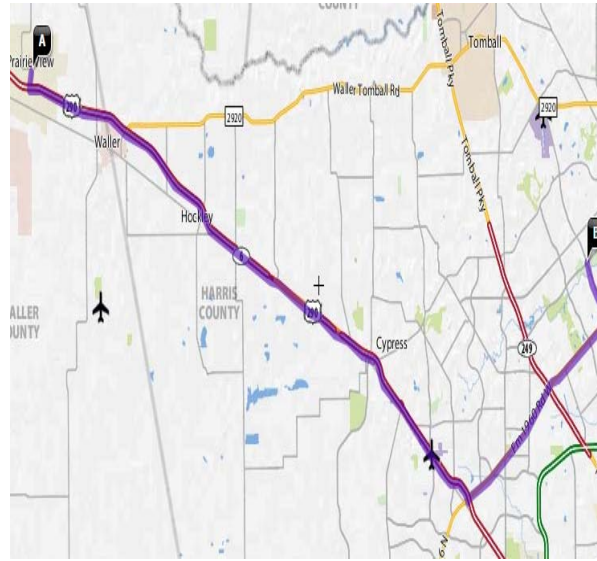

The John B. Coleman Library extends library services to off campus students and faculty at the Northwest Campus and to the students enrolled in Prairie View A&M University Dallas courses.

Distance Library Services include:
