- 2. Serves as a forum for the interaction of campus service providers and their user communities by monitoring the various aspects of campus usage, and by periodically soliciting the feedback of users.
- 3. Advise the Academic community of opportunities to share technology across all-Academic units.
- 4. Regularly update bylaws and procedures for Academic technology information support across campus
- 5. Review actual and proposed changes in the administrative structures that support information technology and resources.
- 6. Formulate statements of general policy related to information technology and resources
- 7. Recommend, advise on, and monitor progress towards the improvement of campus information technology literacy through the training of campus personnel
- 8. Undertake other activities it considers appropriate to foster and promote the effective and efficient use of information technologies and resources.
- 9. Identify training and development needs for Academic Affairs that includes an Annual Technology Summit
