

Free Summer Meals for Kids

Summer 2020, the U.S Secretary of Agriculture, Sonny Perdue will provide all parents some relief in feeding their children. In wake of the nation reopening and parents returning to work, he announced nationwide extension of key flexibilities for USDA's child nutrition programs. According to a new waiver, local partners who worked overtime serving meals to kids during the COVID-19 crisis will continue to serve free meals to all children. This nationwide waiver will allow all children in all areas to receive free meals through the USDA's summer meals programs. In the past, these meals were limited to low income areas.
