

Everyday 4-H: Life Skills for Thriving Curriculum Lesson: Sewing a Simple Tote Bag



Time: 40 minutes to one hour

Objectives-The 4-H member will:

- 1. Learn how to construct an item using upholstery or heavy duty fabric
- 2. Be introduced to procedures used to attach webbing to a product
- 3. Create, measure and sew folded edges
- 4. Construct a Zig-zag stitch on item

Supplies/Equipment:

- 1. Sewing Machine
- 2. Ironing Board
- 3. Iron
- 4. Upholstery/Heavy (1/2 yard)
- 5. Contrasting thread
- 6. Webbing (two yards)
- 7. Applique pattern (4-H clover)

Overview:

4-H members develop life skills to improve their academic achievements, hone their career awareness skills, create better lives, have better communication skills, volunteer and serve their communities.

Competing in 4-H Clothing and Textiles projects is one way youth can display their sewing competence levels, present and defend a project and use their communication and team work skills to show products.

Products can be used as club fundraisers, donations to community groups, and entrepreneurship efforts.

Directions:

- 1. Cut two 16" tall by 14" wide pieces of fabric. Make sure the pattern (if any) is going the correct direction on both panels.
- 2. Cut two 23" long pieces of coordinated webbing.
- 3. Using a single piece of fabric, turn down 1/8" from top edge to wrong side and press. Repeat on other piece of fabric.
- 4. Fold down ½" from previously folded edge and use a zig zag stitch. Repeat on other piece of fabric.
- 5. Pin the handle pieces to the finished top edge of the right side of each panel placing webbing 3" from the sides.
- 6. The raw edges of the handles should match up with the finished edge of the top of the panel.
- 7. Straighten the handles.
- 8. Turn the panels so their wrong sides are facing up. Press and pin their top edges with the handles down 1 ½."
- 9. Sew across the top edge of the panel and the bottom attaching webbing. Repeat on other panel.



- 10. Back stitch at the beginning and end of each seam.
- 11. Pin the panels right sides together.



- 12. Use a ziz-zag stitich to sew along the sides and bottom $\frac{1}{2}$ " -inch from the raw edges, pivoting and leaving the needle and thread in at bottom corners.
- 13. Turn the bag right sides out press the interior seams flat, the sides and corners.



Do (Activity/Experience):

4-H members can sew these bags to serve as a One Day 4-H project. The bags may be given to Hurricane Harvey victims, the elderly or as gifts. Bags can also be sold as a fund-raiser project for clubs. How would you determine the selling/retail price of one bag?
