

**Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES)
Reporting and Disclosure (Student Portion)
Quarterly Report (Final Report-December 2020)**

In accordance with the reporting requirements of Section 18004(e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU), an institution receiving funds under this section, is providing the following information:

1. PVAMU acknowledges that the University signed and returned to the Department of Education the Certification and Agreement on April 17, 2020. The institution further certifies it will use a minimum of 50% of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. PVAMU will receive \$6,876,464.00 from the Department pursuant to the University's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of November 11, 2020 is \$ 6,876,464.00.
4. The estimated total number of students at PVAMU eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is:

2019-2020: 8,548

2020-2021: 8,342

*Please note, this figure is derived from the number of students with a completed 19 – 20 and/or a 20-21 FAFSA and who were registered for Spring20, Summer20 and/or Fall20 semesters at Prairie View A&M University. This data is valid through 10/6/2020

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 5,763 as of the date listed in number 3 above.
6. PVAMU has awarded grants of up to \$1,000 under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act. Currently enrolled students were able to apply for grants for Spring 2020, Summer 2020 and Fall 2020 via a simple online application process. The PVAMU CARES Review Team received the applications, reviewed them for completeness and eligibility under the CARES Act, and coordinated the awarding of the funds. Eligible students were able to apply for grants for expenses related to the disruption of campus operations due to coronavirus, including housing and food insecurity, medical expenses, moving and transportation expenses, and lack of educational support and supplies (including technology).
