1. Effective for Spring 2015 applications, all students must have passed the state certification content exam **prior** to admission into **Clinical Experiences**.
2. The Clinical Experiences application information can be found
3. Students must submit the complete clinical experiences packet to the Office of Clinical Experiences and have a GPA of ≥ 2.75 .

Certification Requirements

1. Complete all coursework on your degree plan with a GPA of ≥ 2.75
2. No grades of "D" in your major or concentration areas.
3. Complete Clinical Experiences.
4. Pass the required state content exam(s) which is currently the Texas Examinations of Educator Standards (TExES).
5. Pass the required state Pedagogy exam(s) which is currently the Texas Examinations of Educator Standards (TExES).
6. Pay the required fees to the Texas Education Agency. Go to [to https://tea.texas.gov](https://tea.texas.gov) and select certification.
7. Access and complete the online Application for Certification found at the PVAMU Office of Student Support Services and Certification.
8. Scan and email the completed Application for Certification along with copies of score reports to Graduate-edcert@pvamu.edu or Undergraduate-coetestprep@pvamu.edu
9. Order an official transcript showing the degree conferred: deliver to the Office of Student Support Services and Certification.
