ETS recognizes and rewards talented undergraduate students

As a nonprofit organization, ETS's mission is to advance education for all learners worldwide. But that mission extends beyond developing large-scale tests and conducting psychometric research to expanding opportunities for students who are driven to succeed — in the classroom and in the community.

In recognition of that mission and our longstanding collaboration with Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), ETS administers a merit-based, full-tuition scholarship — the **ETS Presidential Scholarship for HBCU Students**.

Students from all majors and disciplines, who attend any of the HBCUs throughout the United States and its territories, are eligible to apply for the one-year scholarship. We will grant up to eight awards in total (or up to four scholarships each for both public and private HBCU students).

Who can apply for the **ETS Presidential Scholarship for HBCU Students?**

Applicants must:

- attend an HBCU
- hold a sophomore or junior standing (based on credit hours completed) at the time of application
- be enrolled as a full-time student progressing toward his or her first bachelor's degree
- have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 (on a 4-point scale)
- obtain a letter of recommendation from the president of their college or university
- obtain a letter of support/endorsement from the faculty member, department head or dean most familiar with their academic work
- have a financial need
