**ABOUT THE PANTHERS**

The Prairie View A&M Panthers continued their winning ways as they overcame a seven-point deficit to Alabama State en route to a 24-10 conference win on Saturday, Oct. 10 in Montgomery, Ala. The win keeps Prairie View atop the SWAC West standings and sets the team up for an important divisional showdown against Southern in two weeks.

On Sept. 5, Prairie View A&M began the year and the SWAC schedule on a positive note as they defeated SWAC rival Texas Southern 17-7 in the 25th edition of the Labor Day Classic in Houston, Texas. The Panthers put forth an impressive defensive effort in the win as they held TSU scoreless with their lone score via an interception return.

The classic marked the debut of quarterback **Jay Bluford** and the senior from Maryland had a solid game with two touchdown passes. On the ground, redshirt sophomore **Michael Jason** also had a solid outing and provided the Panthers another option in the team's running game as he led the team in rushing.

On defense, Prairie View

featured a revamped linebacker corps which impressed the coaching staff as the starting linebackers combined to account for 24 tackles. First-time starter **Lester Butler** also opened eyes as the cornerback finished with eight tackles and held TSU All-American **William Osborne** in check throughout the game.

As expected, special teams was a strength for the Panthers as **Pedro Ventura** averaged 43 yards per punt while **Brady Faggard** nailed the game's only field goal.

The following weekend on Sept. 12, the Panthers made history and faced an FBS member for the first time since Hawai'i in 1979 in New Mexico State. While many expected the Panthers to rollover, Prairie View came to play and went toe-to-toe with the WAC member as they fell short by three points in a 21-18 road loss.

In that contest, the Panthers started out strong, faded in the middle but closed out the game strong as Western Kentucky transfer quarterback **K.J. Black** led a 15-point fourth quarter charge to put the Panthers in position to win.

Due to the cancellation of the annual Angel City Classic this past

**MONTGOMERY, Ala. - KJ Black** threw for 341 yards and a touchdown to lead Prairie View A&M to a 24-10 victory over Alabama State on Saturday.

Black was 22 of 33 and threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to **Shaun Stephens** to help the Panthers (3-1, 3-0 Southwestern Athletic Conference) gain 413 yards total offense. Black also scored on a 1-yard run to give Prairie View A&M a 17-7 lead with 6:24 remaining in the third quarter.

Stephens caught seven passes for 99 yards and **Anthony Weeden** had five catches for 126 yards, including a 77-yarder that set up the Panthers' final score.

**Donald Babers'** 1-yard run gave Prairie View A&M a 24-7 lead with 48 seconds left in the third quarter.

Alabama State (3-2, 0-2) was led by Chris Mitchell, who was 15 of 35 for 219 yards and rushed for 61 yards on 16 carries.

spring that was scheduled for Sept. 19, the Panthers were off for two consecutive weekends but showed no signs of rust as they knocked off Grambling State 35-32 for the first time since 1986 in Dallas.

Last weekend, Prairie View upped its streak to two games with a 24-10 win over Alabama State in Montgomery, Ala.

### ABOUT THE MVSU DELTA DEVILS

The Mississippi Valley State Delta Devils have endured a lot of ups and downs over the past few seasons. Picked to finish fourth in the SWAC East standings, MVSU dropped its first two contests of the year before rebounding to beat Alabama State 10-3 in the annual Chicago Football Classic on Sept. 26.

Mississippi Valley State knocked off Texas College the following weekend but returned to SWAC action last weekend and dropped a 32-10 contest to Alcorn State. In that contest, MVSU was on the wrong end of a FCS record as they allowed 14 sacks.

Led by eighth-year head coach and alum **Willie Totten**, MVSU relies on the pass heavily as quarterback **Paul Roberts** leads the team with 911 yards passing and seven touchdowns. Wide receiver **Brandon Stargell** is Roberts' favorite target with 20 receptions for 287 yards while linebacker **Rory Malone** leads the defense with 31 tackles.

### THE LAST TIME THEY MET

**Mark Spivey** threw for 252 yards and ran for 77 yards and three touchdowns to lead Prairie View to a 49-15 rout over Mississippi Valley State on Saturday night.

The Delta Devils (1-2) had a 7-0 lead in the first quarter on a 5-yard touchdown run. But the Panthers (3-0) answered when **Donald Babers** scored on a 2-yard run and Spivey threw a 15-yard to Shaun Stephens to give them a 14-7 lead in the second quarter.

**Russell Ball** scored on a 10-yard run to push Prairie View's lead to 22-7 in the third. Spivey threw a 10-yard touchdown to Stephens in the third then **Jay Buford** connected with Stephens for a 6-yard score to give the Panthers a 36-7 lead in the fourth.

**Eddie Ivory**, who completed 4 of 14 passes threw for 63 yards for the Delta Devils. He also had a team-leading 31 yards rushing on five carries.

### THE LAST TIME

Prairie View has a two-game winning streak over the Delta Devils that dates back to 2007. The last time Prairie View won more than two straight over the Delta Devils occurred from 1987 to 1989 under former head coaches **Conway Hayman** and **Haney Catchings**.

The last time Mississippi Valley State played Prairie View A&M for homecoming at Blackshear Stadium, it was all Delta Devils as they scored early and often in a 58-13 win on Oct. 29, 2005.

### HOME, SWEET HOME

Blackshear Field has turned into a homefield advantage for the Panthers under head coach **Henry Frazier III** as they're 6-0 at home since 2007.

In homecomings at Blackshear, Frazier is 3-2.

Since ending their losing streak in 1998, the Panthers have played well on their home field. Of the team's 39 wins since 1998, 17 wins have occurred at Blackshear Field.

### DÉJÀ VU

Two years ago in Dallas, Texas at the Cotton Bowl, former PV quarterback **Mark Spivey** had his coming out party as the current PV grad assistant was inserted in the second half and helped spark the Panthers to an exciting finish in a 17-14 loss. From that point, Spivey found his groove and went 14-2 as a starter.

Lightening could strike twice as quarterback **K.J. Black** followed his second-half performance against New Mexico State with a memorable performance in the Cotton Bowl on Oct. 3 in the win against Grambling State. Black started once again against Ala-

bama State and followed it up with his best passing performance of the year en route to a 24-10 win and his second consecutive SWAC Offensive Player of the Week honor.

## REMEMBER US?

While homecoming will be in full effect on Saturday at Prairie View A&M, homecoming will also take place on the field as several members of the Mississippi Valley State coaching staff have strong ties to Prairie View A&M.

Defensive coordinator **Keith Scott** served as a graduate assistant for two years at Prairie View (2005-06) while quarterbacks coach **Chris Totten** and defensive line coach **Derrick Mason** spent several years at Prairie View under head coach **Larry Dorsey** (2000-2002) and **C.L. Whittington** (2003).

## OUT TO MAKE HISTORY (AGAIN)

Junior running back **Donald Babers** made history last season as the Houston native became Prairie View's first 1,000-yard rusher since 1988. Having already rushed for 1,567 yards in two years, he'll need 2,016 yards to break the school record of 3,703 yards **John Payton** set from 1952-55. After a slow start in the season opener, Babers returned to his old self with a 118-yard effort at New Mexico State on Sept. 12 and 67 yards against Grambling State on Oct. 3.

## QUESTION MARKS NO MORE

Entering the season-opening game versus TSU, PV boasted several question marks at multiple positions including quarterback, linebacker and secondary.

With the departure of three starters at linebacker last year, the Panthers began the year with a re-vamped linebacker unit. However, they've performed well as all three starters rank among the top four tacklers on the team.

In the secondary, redshirt sophomore **Lester Butler** has 19 tackles in his first season as a starter while quarterbacks **Jay Bluford** and **K.J. Black** have combined to throw for six touchdown passes.

## ALL IN THE (PANTHER) FAMILY

Purple and gold runs deep for Panther football team members **Renoldo** and **Alonzo Revuelta**.

Natives of Port Arthur, Texas, the brothers are the third and fourth members of their immediate family to suit up at Prairie View. From 2003-2007, older brother and current graduate assistant **Ralph Revuelta** played tight end for the Panthers and was the second member of his family to play at PV. Their father, **Arnold**, also played football at Prairie View and was an assistant football coach in the mid-1980s at the university.

In addition, their mother (**Elizabeth**) also graduated from Prairie View.

Both Alonzo and Ralph started their careers out at quarterback but moved to tight end.

## FRAZIER IN OCTOBER

PVAMU head coach **Henry Frazier III** is 22-18 lifetime when playing in the month of October

Since he arrived at Prairie View in 2004, he sports a record of 10-12 in the month. The past two Octobers have been successful for Frazier as the Washington D.C. native went 3-0 in 2007 and 3-1 in 2008.

## PANTHERS IN THE POLLS

Prairie View A&M is ranked third in this week's *Sheridan Broadcast Network* Football Poll and third in the *BoxtoRow.com/BASN* HBCU Football Top 10 weekly poll. The Panthers received 161 votes this week in *The Sports Network* FCS Top 25 Poll and are four teams out from earning a national ranking.

## SCORE EARLY, SIT BACK AND RELAX

Prairie View's success last year can be attributed to its performance in the first quarter. Last season, the Panthers outscored opponents 86-21 in the first quarter.

So far, PV has outscored teams 24-21 in the quarter this year.

## INTERCEPTION MACHINE

Senior safety **Anthony Beck** has turned into an interception machine with nine picks over the course of his three-year career.

After combining for three interceptions his first two years, the Houston, Texas native picked off five passes last year for 133 yards and two touchdowns. He has three INT returns for a score in his career and holds the school record.

Beck finally nabbed his first interception this season as he picked off a pass in the endzone against Alabama State on Oct. 10.

## GOT TO FIX THAT

After struggling to begin the year, the Prairie View A&M Panthers are improving their third down conversion rate as they're 42 percent on the season. In the season opener, Prairie View struggled on third down conversions as they were only 3 of 15 and 4 of 12 versus New Mexico State on Sept. 12. On Oct. 3, the Panthers improved on third downs by going 6 of 11 and 9 of 16 against Alabama State on Oct. 10.

In addition, penalty yardage is a problem as the team has amassed 40 penalties totaling 363 yards.

## COLD-BLOODED

Prairie View has shown it has guts on fourth down as the Panthers are 6-of-9 on fourth down conversions this season.

## MORE THAN SPECIAL

Special teams is an important facet of the game and Prairie View's punter, **Pedro Ventura**, can attest to that.

An All-SWAC punter, Ventura averaged 39.3 yards per punt in 2008 with a long of 60 yards. On kickoffs, the Houston native recorded six touchbacks and also served as PV's long field goal specialist as he went 2-for-2 with a long 37 yards.

On Sept. 5, Ventura proved his worth once again as he averaged 43.8 yards per punt in the win over TSU. Against New Mexico State on Sept. 12, Ventura once again averaged 43.8 yards per punt and nailed three touchbacks.

Although he had a punt

blocked on Oct. 3, Ventura still managed to average 48.7 yards a punt and pinned GSU deep inside the 5-yard line on its final offensive possession.

Last weekend, Ventura averaged 50.6 yards per punt with a long of 70 yards.

## FIVE PANTHERS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-SWAC

Representing Prairie View on the All-SWAC First Team are running back **Donald Babers**, offensive lineman **James Dekle**, defensive end **Quinton Spears**, defensive back **Anthony Beck** and punter **Pedro Ventura**. Earning second team honors were offensive lineman **James Blanton** and tight end **Marlon Allen**.

Babers, Beck, Dekle, Spears and Ventura earned all-conference honors last season following Prairie View's 9-1 campaign while this marks the first time both Blanton and Allen received All-SWAC accolades.

In addition to the SWAC's preseason teams, a total of nine Panthers received either First or Second Team All-SWAC Honors by *Phil Steele's College Football Preview*.

The quartet of Babers, Beck, Dekle and Spears received first team honors while Allen, Ventura, offensive lineman **Stoney Owens**, defensive lineman **Dalvin Nettles** and line-backer **Renaldo Revuelta** landed spots on the second team.

## THE HEAD COACHES

**Henry Frazier III** begins his sixth season as head coach of the Prairie View A&M University Panthers. He became the 30th head football coach in PVAMU athletic history on Dec. 22, 2003.

After a history-making 2007 season, Frazier continued to rewrite the record books in 2008 as he led the Panthers to a No. 25 national ranking after the team posted its best record since 1964 following a 9-1 season. Due to his efforts, the national media took notice as Frazier was named the *Sheridan Broadcast Network/Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year* in addition to the American Football Coaches Region III FCS Coach of the Year. On the gridiron, the Panthers were dominant on both sides of the ball as they ranked second nationally in scoring

defense and third in both total and rush defense.

In 2007, the Panthers enjoyed a four-game turnaround from the previous season as their 7-3 record marked the program's first winning season since 1976. For his history-making efforts on the field, Frazier was selected as Coach of the Year by the College Sporting News and the Black College Sports Page.

During the 2006 campaign, Frazier and staff made history as they defeated Southern University for the first time since 1988 with an overtime victory. Also during the season, Frazier guided Prairie View to its first defensive shutout since 1987 and its first-ever win in school history over Alabama A&M.

In 2005, Frazier continued Prairie View's upward swing and guided the Panthers to their best season since 1988 with a 5-6 record. Included among the highlights was the Panthers' first victory over Jackson State since 1971 and the team's first SWAC road win in 17 years. In addition, Frazier moved into some elite company and joined PVAMU legendary head football coach **William "Billy" Nicks** as the only other coach in Prairie View history to beat Texas Southern in consecutive seasons.

Prior to his arrival in 2004, Prairie View had posted two consecutive one-win seasons in 2002 and 2003. In his first season at Prairie View, Frazier and staff led the Panthers to their most wins since 2001 by winning a total of three games. Prairie View also defeated arch rival Texas Southern for the first time in 15 years, beating the Tigers 25-7 in the 20th annual Labor Day Classic. In doing so, he led the Panthers to their first 2-0 start since 1964.

When comparing Frazier's current win totals he has already eclipsed the win marks of the last 11 coaches at PVAMU.

A native of Washington D.C. and a 1993 graduate of Bowie State University, Frazier played quarterback for BSU and went 18-3-1 as a starter. He guided the Bulldogs to the NCAA playoffs in 1988 and a Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association Championship in 1989. Upon graduating from Bowie State, Frazier entered the coaching ranks and had tremendous success as a head coach on the high

school level in Maryland. Frazier continued to climb the coaching ladder and was named the head football coach at Bowie State in 1999. He quickly turned his alma mater into one of the CIAA's best.

In 2001, Frazier led Bowie State to its best season since 1989 with a 7-3 record. For his success on the field, he was selected as the Coach of the Year by the CIAA and 100 percent Wrong Club in Atlanta, Ga. In addition, the 2001 Bulldogs also fielded the number one ranked pass defense and number seven ranked defense in NCAA Division II.

After an impressive 2001 season, Frazier moved the BSU program to another level during the 2002 season with their first-ever CIAA Eastern Division title and CIAA championship game appearance. Continuing the winning tradition in 2003, he guided the Bulldogs to their third consecutive winning season with a second place finish in the CIAA Eastern Division. Frazier's 26-24 career record at Bowie State currently stands as the most victories by any football coach at BSU. Frazier's coaching philosophy centers around the belief that for a program to become successful, its players need to have fun on the field.

With the success Frazier has had on-and-off the gridiron, it's no surprise that other programs have taken notice and recruited several members of his coaching staff away from him over the years. Despite being young by coaching standards,

Frazier has created an impressive coaching tree over the course of his 11-year career as he has had several former staff members serve as head coaches, coordinators or staff members on the NCAA's FBS, FCS and Division II levels.

Frazier is married to the former LaNier Turner of Washington, D.C. They have three children, Brijan (19), Brinia (10) and Henry IV (8).

**Willie Totten** is poised and primed as he is in the midst of his eighth season at the helm of the Delta Devils football program.

A 1986 graduate of Mississippi Valley State, the former offensive coordinator was named to the post Dec. 21, 2001, becoming the 14th coach in the history of the storied program.

The former standout quarterback – who is partially credited with bringing Mississippi Valley into the national spotlight – continues to strive to return the Delta Devils to the “Golden Age”, an age when he earned the nickname “Satellite” by passing himself and MVSU into the NCAA national books while embedding their feats into the hearts of the Valley faithful.

Totten began his venture to become the head man at Valley just 10 miles east of the campus in his birthplace of Greenwood, Miss. The second son of William and Willie Mae Totten, “Satellite” dreamed of being a big-time athlete at the early age of five.

Then-head coach Archie Cooley, an innovative and energetic coach, was looking for someone to guide his pass-oriented offense; he found it in Totten, who in his rookie season earned All-SWAC honors. When Totten had finished his career at MVSU, he had helped the Delta Devils to a 28-11-1 record as the captain of “The Satellite Express” offense and passed for over 50 NCAA records. In 1984, he was the national leader in total offensive yards per game, having gained 4,572 yards in 10 games (457.2 per game average). Also, in 1983 and 1984, he was the NCAA annual champion in passing with efficiency ratings of 167.5 and 163.6, respectively.

After a tenured professional career that spanned two stints in the Canadian Football League – drafted by the British Columbia Lions and a member of the Toronto Argonauts – Totten moved on the Buffalo Bills and the Pittsburg Gladiators of the Arena League. He then went on to pursue a master's degree at Grambling State University and embarked on his coaching career. In 1998-99, Totten worked as a graduate assistant under GSU's legendary coach Eddie Robinson. He received his master's of science degree in sports administration for GSU in

1989.

Totten returned to the Delta Devils family in the spring of 1990, become an assistant football coach under Larry Dorsey. He served in various capacities under Dorsey, including serving as the running backs and quarterbacks coach as well as the offensive coordinator from 1996-98. He also held the role of head women's and men's tennis coach from 1990-96.

In 1998, Totten assumed the position of head football coach and athletics director at Eastside High School in Cleveland, Miss. After two seasons, he returned to MVSU before the start of the 2000 campaign. As the head coach in 2002, he led the program to the biggest turnaround in the division I-AA that season (0-11 in 2001 to 5-6 in 2002).

As a student at MVSU, Totten became acquainted with the former Phaedra Brown of Yazoo City. The two married and are blessed with two daughters – Josta and Trasyty.

A member of the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame, in August 2005, Totten was enshrined as part of the College Football Hall of Fame in South Bend, Ind.

Totten is a member of the American Football Coaches Association, the Mississippi High School Athletic Association, the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

## **PVAMU COACHES RECEIVE NFL EXPERIENCE**

While the majority of college football coaches across the nation were preparing for the start of their respective summer football camps at the end of July, three members of the Prairie View A&M University experienced life on the professional level as they were selected to participate in the Bill Walsh NFL Minority Coaches Internship Program.

The purpose of the Bill Walsh NFL Minority Coaches Internship Program is to expose talented minority college coaches to the methods and philosophies of summer NFL training camps. As a result, the program has brought more than 1,300 minority coaches into NFL training camps -- and produced four present head coaches -- after the man who conceived of the idea, Pro Football Hall of Fame coach

Bill Walsh.

Representing Prairie View A&M at NFL training camps this past summer were defensive coordinator **Heishma Northern** (Oakland Raiders), running backs coach **Dwayne Foster** (Buffalo Bills) and defensive line coach **Miles Brandon** (Pittsburgh Steelers).

**Labor Day Classic XXV**

Played before more than 21,000 fans at Reliant Stadium, **Jay Bluford** rebounded from an early interception and threw a pair of touchdown passes as Prairie View A&M defeated Texas Southern, 17-7 in the 25th edition of the Labor Day Classic.
