**Abstract:** Edison Holmes Anderson was the Director of the Music Department at Langston University, where he established a well-known Acapella Choir. In 1958, he became the director of vocal-choral music at PVAMU, and he organized a vocal group consisting of students from all branches of the college, the Prairie View A Cappella Concert Choir. The Edison H. Anderson collection covers his time as director of vocal chorus from 1953-1977.

**Biographical Note:** Edison Holmes Anderson was born on October 3, 1916, in Terrell, Texas, where he attended elementary and high school. After graduating from PVAMU in 1938, he accepted a position at Grand Central Junior High School in Kaufman Texas, where he served as principal from 1938 to 1940. In 1941, he became the director of music at Arkansas State College, and he met and married Gloria C. Edwards. The couple had three children, Edison Jr., Clementine, and Samuel Edward.

He received master's and doctorate degrees from Iowa State University, where he studied in the Opera workhouse under the direction of Dr. Stark, and he also earned a specialist diploma in music at Columbia University in New York City. He was soloist in the Columbia University Choir under the direction of Robert Shaw of Juilliard. While studying in New York, he also performed *Braaten's Alto Rhapsody* with noted singer Carol Brice.

Anderson went on to serve as the Director of the Music Department at Langston University, where he established a well-known Acapella Choir. Anderson was chosen as the conductor of the All-State Choir at the Festival of Oklahoma, which attests to his enthusiasm for working with young people in groups of all sizes as well as to those who have been inspired towards a professional goal.

In 1958, he became the director of vocal-choral music at PVAMU, and he organized a vocal group consisting of students from all branches of the college, the Prairie View A Cappella Concert Choir. His vocal students and choirs performed in hundreds of cities throughout the nation, and he did numerous radio, television, and recital performances. Anderson passed away on January 7, 1976, and PVAMU established a scholarship in his honor.

**Scope & Contents:** The Edison H. Anderson collection covers his time as director of vocal chorus from 1953-1977. The collection consists mostly of Programs of A Cappella concert choir and other printed materials such as poems and scholarship materials.
