### Show Me the Money

Prairie View A&M University Extension (PVAMU Extension) and the Prairie View A&M University Northwest Houston Center are pleased to partner with the Childs Legacy Law Firm to offer monthly legal educational workshops. Since March 2025, these legal workshops are held on the first Saturday of the month at the PVAMU NWHC with the topics varying each month. To date, topics have included understanding the cause, and how to resolve and prevent the occurrence of heirs' property, estate planning, trusts, Wills, and expunctions. Workshop attendees were even offered a simple Will prepared by the Childs Legacy Law Firm free of charge.

Dr. Kamala Williams, Director of the PVAMU NWHC said, "We are pleased to offer these educational opportunities to the public. While the PVAMU NWHC is based in northwest Houston, the programs we offer are not geographically based; they are open to anyone who wishes to take advantage of the educational information that's being made available. We are especially pleased to work with the staff of the PVAMU Extension Community and Economic Development (CED) and Agriculture and Natural Resources (AgNR) within the PVAMU College of Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources to develop and deliver this very important program.

"The 'Show Me the Money' series is still a relatively new program that we're offering," said Angela Moore, Program Coordinator with PVAMU Extension Ag and Natural Resource, member of the "Show Me the Money" planning committee and official trainer for the Southern Regional Development Center's (SRDC) "Understanding Heirs' Property at the Community Level". "As we continue the series, we expect more people will learn about it and as the level of awareness increases, we expect the level of participation will increase, as well. This is one of the best uses of three hours of time a person seeking to level up can make. You get free legal educational information that could help you not only protect your assets but potentially grow your assets and create generational wealth."

"There is no question there is a great need for the legal information we provide," said Gregory Rose, Harris County Extension Agent with PVAMU Extension Community and Economic Development and Co-Chair of the planning committee. "In addition to protecting and growing their assets, program participants can learn information to help improve their greatest asset—themselves. One example of this is participants can learn what to do clear their records through a process called expunction. This alone would be a huge game changer in that an expunction could remove adverse information from a person's record which otherwise could make it difficult for them to gain employment, obtain certain driver's licenses, and keep other opportunities out of reach."
