15.05.04.P1 High Risk Global Engagements and High Risk International Collaborations

Approved: March 13, 2023

Revised April 27, 2026

Next Scheduled Review: April 1, 2031

Rule Summary

Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU) supports international research, teaching, learning, and engagement activities that advance the university's academic and research mission. PVAMU is committed to safeguarding the integrity of its research and educational programs and ensuring compliance with applicable federal and state laws, The Texas A&M University System (System) policies and regulations, and research security requirements. This rule establishes PVAMU's institutional processes for identifying, reviewing, approving, and monitoring High-Risk Global Engagements and High-Risk International Collaborations in accordance with System Regulation [*15.05.04, High Risk Global Engagements and High Risk International Collaborations*](#).

Rule

1. GENERAL

1.1 Prohibitions

- 1.1.1 All employees are prohibited from participating in Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Programs.
- 1.1.2 PVAMU will not maintain a contract or agreement with Confucius Institutes.
- 1.1.3 All employees are prohibited from accepting gifts from a Country of Concern. PVAMU employees must report to the Export Control Office any activities where employees are approached by groups representing a Country of Concern that offers gifts or travel.
- 1.1.4 All employees are prohibited from entering into High-Risk Global Engagements and participating in High-Risk International Collaborations with entities on the most recent list developed pursuant to [Section 1286 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 \(Public Law 115-232\)](#) as amended.

1.2 Travel to Countries of Concern

- 1.2.1 All employee professional travel to a Country of Concern must be reviewed through the process detailed in Section 3. All employees must report personal travel to Countries of Concern in Workday.

1.3 Gifts

1.3.1 Proposed institutional gifts directly or indirectly from a citizen of a foreign adversary must be reviewed through the process detailed in Section 3.

1.4 PVAMU will work with the System Research Security Office (RSO) and Office of General Counsel when responding to federal funding agency research security inquiries.

2. AUTHORIZED OFFICIALS

2.1 The Vice President for Research and Innovation or their designee serves as PVAMU's Empowered Official (EO) for purposes of this rule and is responsible for oversight of research security and export control compliance.

2.2 The Export Controls Officer (ECO) is responsible for evaluating export control requirements, assessing the involvement of Countries of Concern, and ensuring compliance with applicable federal, state, and System requirements.

2.3 The Executive Director of International Programs or their designee supports international research, teaching, and engagement activities and conducts preliminary reviews of proposed global engagements and international collaborations.

3. HIGH-RISK GLOBAL ENGAGEMENTS AND HIGH-RISK INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS ADMINISTRATION

3.1 High Risk Global Engagements and High Risk International Collaborations must be received by the Executive Director of International Programs no less than 20 days in advance of the proposed activity.

3.2 The Executive Director of International Programs is responsible for the preliminary review of all global engagements or international collaborations, whether initiated internally or externally, before routing to the ECO for high-risk determination. The preliminary review involves ensuring that there is no potential conflict of commitment, conflict of interest, health and safety risk, or undue foreign influence.

3.3 The ECO will conduct a comprehensive review of the proposed High-Risk Global Engagement or High-Risk International Collaboration. Once the ECO completes the comprehensive review, the EO has the authority to deny the high-risk proposed activity before submitting it to the System RSO for review and approval, pursuant to System Regulation [15.05.04](#).

3.4 If approved by the EO, the ECO will route the High-Risk Global Engagement or High-Risk International Collaboration by submitting it to the System RSO for review and approval pursuant to System Regulation [15.05.04](#).

3.5 Once a final determination is provided by the System RSO, the ECO will notify any other PVAMU offices possibly involved. Any defined mitigating measures for approvals will be monitored by the ECO or designated PVAMU office.

- 3.6 All High-Risk Global Engagements will be maintained in Maestro.
- 3.7 The ECO will ensure training in TrainTraq Course #2111212 is completed by individuals involved in high-risk global engagements or high-risk international collaborations once every two years.
