Terms

- **Residential College:** a residential community teeming with academic and thematic activity, student and faculty engagement.
- **Residential Curriculum** – curricular and co-curricular based offerings within residential spaces that advances academic learning, developmental growth, and career readiness.
- **Living-Learning Community:** a living environment that brings students and faculty together around a classroom experience.
- **FYE-First Year Experience:** programs and opportunities focus on freshman acclimation to university life.
- **SYE-Second Year Experience:** programs and opportunities focus on sophomore engagement and retention.

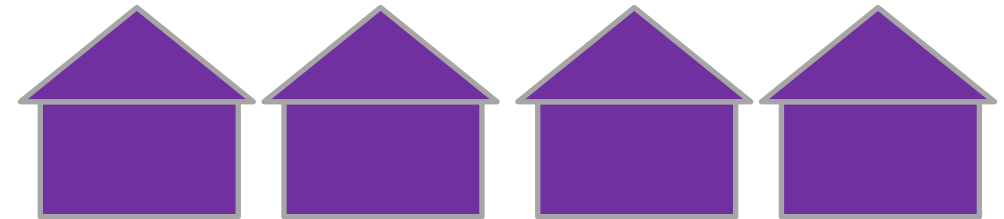
