A. Personal Statement

Prairie View A&M University is the second-oldest public institution of higher education in the state of Texas. It is a historically black college/university that, since its inception in 1876, has opened its doors to any and every person – inside and outside of Texas – seeking a first-class, four-year university experience.

In this application, I will work as key personnel to assist Dr. Qian in coordinating various activities at the Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU), including the recruitment and mentoring of students, the development of courses and workshops within the context of the new public health degree which is scheduled to be offered Fall 2022 on the campus PVAMU. Public health informatics will be aligned with existing and up-coming programs at the university, and the training of students.

I serve as Professor/Director of the Texas Undergraduate Medical Academy (UMA) at Prairie View A&M University. I also hold faculty status as professor (Epidemiology) in the Department of Medical Humanities in the Texas A&M University College of Medicine. During my 17 years at Prairie View A&M University as Director of the UMA, I have concurrently served as Interim Dean of the College of Juvenile Justice and Psychology, Associate Vice President of Research/Associate Dean of Graduate Studies as well as Interim Dean of the Whitlowe R. Green College of Education.

In my 17 years as a member of the Texas Undergraduate Medical Academy, I have mentored more 300 undergraduate and graduate students. I have served as mentor and career counselor to them, many of whom are active physicians, dentists, veterinarians, pharmacists and public health professionals. Prior to Prairie View A&M University, I have served as faculty at the University of Texas Medical Branch (Medical School and Graduate School in Biomedical

Sciences, Indiana University at Bloomington in the School of Medicine and the School of Health, Physical Education and Recreation (William Yarber Endowed Professor in HIV/AIDS) and Emory University School of Medicine. My professional experience also includes service as Coordinator of Epidemiology (Marion County Health and Hospital Corporation – Indianapolis, Indiana), Sr. Deputy Director of Population, Personal Health and Clinical Services (Fulton County Georgia) and Interim Director of the Fulton County Department of Health and Wellness.

I have more than 20 years of research focusing on the application of Epidemiology and Research Methods. My primary research focus is the use of epidemiological methodology in the control and prevention of chronic diseases (diabetes and hypertension) that are responsible for end stage renal disease and the infectious disease HIV/AIDS. Recent research has examined the epidemiology of HIV/AIDS among older Americans. A secondary research focus is the effective design of epidemiological studies of organ donation/transplantation among under-represented minorities.
