Crochet Club News
















On November 30th the Crochet Club members donated over 40 of their homemade hats to the Waller Pregnancy Center.



Alumni Spotlight Q&A

Dr. Jason Monroe graduated in 2007 with a B.S. in Chemistry from Prairie View A&M University. He graduated from Texas Southern University in 2014 and began working as a CVS Pharmacist right out of pharmacy school, and quickly worked his way up the ranks. In 2015, he was promoted to District Sales Manager and currently holds this position. He also teaches Biostatistics, the pharmacology of Shingles and Cirrhosis, and ethics at Texas Southern University.





Q: Do you have any advice for pre-medicine, pre-dental, and pre-pharmacy students?

A: Take this program seriously and build professional relationships now. If you have an opportunity to meet with a dean of an organization or college, do it. When application time comes, you have mentors. Be an advocate for organizations like the UMA; let this organization truly help you and don't take it for granted.

Q: When you were trying to get accepted into professional school, what steps did you specifically take?

A. Earning prerequisite credits is important; obtaining key leadership roles, such as president of the UMA student president, is also critical. The MCAT, DAT, PCAT, and GRE may hold some of us back, so get into a rigorous program that helps you prepare for those entrance exams. If you accomplish these three goals, nobody can stop you. Additionally, a summer internship over the summer at one of the schools you wish to attend is also important so that you can build relationships.


