Texas Senate Bill 1414 (Summary of provisions outlined within bill)

- Successful completion of *Child Protection Training* (2111652 Train Traq)
- > Questioning suspected or reported abuse:
 - > Ask only:
 - > What happened?
 - > When did this happen?
 - > Who did this to you?
 - > Where were you when this happened?
- > Reporting suspected or reported abuse:
 - > Immediately make a report to local law enforcement.
 - Provide the following:
 - (1) Child's name, description, age and address;
 - (2) The name and address of the person responsible for the care, custody or welfare of the child;
 - (3) Any other information to help authorities assist the child (who, what, when where); and,
 - (4) Notify Camp or Program Director who must file an online report with the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services <u>http://www.txabusehotline.org/Login/Default.aspx</u>.
 - > Maintain the highest level of confidentiality and professionalism when reporting.
 - Report as soon as possible.
- > Camp guidelines should include:
 - > The reporter of the abuse must immediately notify law enforcement and note:
 - (1) The name of the law enforcement official who took the report;
 - (2) The time of the report; and,
 - (3) A brief summary of your discussion.
 - This information must be provided to the program director. The program director will immediately notify the parent/guardian (unless instructed by law enforcement not to contact the parent/guardian). The program director will then file an online report with the <u>Texas Department of Family and Protective Services</u>.
- In summary, if you witness, support or receive a report of child abuse regardless of when the abuse occurred:
 - Remove the child from immediate harm (if presently occurring);
 - Report the abuse to local law enforcement; and,
 - Report the situation to your supervisor or the program director (unless they were the source of abuse or neglect).
