



The Sustainable African American Forestry Land Retention (SFLR)

Enroll in the program to receive free assistance:

- ◆ Forestry management plans
- ◆ Heirs Property Prevention Education
- ◆ Legal Assistance (Wills, Estate Planning, Consultation)

For many African American forest landowners, land represents many things, assets, resources, and wealth. However, despite the economic potential, heirs' property and limited forestland management planning can significantly decrease African American forestland owner's land ownership and wealth-building opportunities. These issues can lead to land retention concerns and missed financial opportunities.

Through Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU) College of Agriculture and Human Sciences (CAHS) Cooperative Extension Program (CEP) Agriculture and Natural Resources (AgNR) Small Farm Institute, the Sustainable African American Forest Land Retention (SFLR) program can help African American forestland owners. The program helps forestland owners get forest management plans, conduct preventive education, and provide resolutions to address heirs' property issues.

In partnership with the Landowners Association of Texas, Texas Agriforestry Small Farmers and Ranchers, Pinewoods Small Farmers & Ranchers Landowners, and 100 Ranchers, Inc. Community Based Organizations, we are assisting forestland owners in various counties through the SFLR program.
