

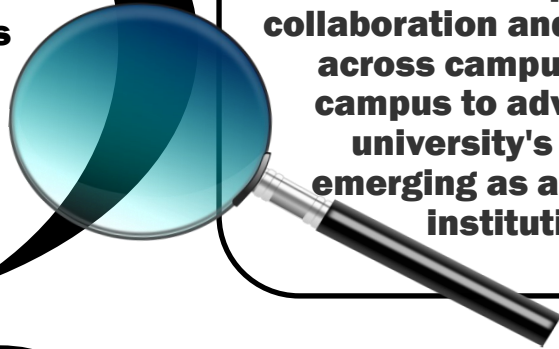

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14th ANNUAL PATHWAYS STUDENT RESEARCH SYMPOSIUM TARLETON STATE UNIVERSITY

The Annual Texas A&M University System Pathway Student Research Symposium provides opportunities for students across different disciplines, to present their research findings. It also allows interaction with peers and advisors from other Texas A&M University System (TAMUS) institutions. A total of 41 students (17 undergraduates, 11 Masters and 13 Doctoral), 9 faculty/staff judges, and 3 staff members from the Office of Research, Innovation and Sponsored Programs participated in the symposium. Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU) students won 1st place for the Master's level, and 1st and 3rd places for undergraduate level. Winners were from College of Agriculture and Human Sciences. UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH INFORMATION SESSION

The Undergraduate Research Information Session at Prairie View A&M University (PVAMU) is a campus-wide collaborative effort of College of the Juvenile Justice and Psychology, Office of Undergraduate Research and Title III Program. The event was designed to educate the students on the benefits and process of effective undergraduate research; and to disseminate information on research and funding opportunities to students, faculty and staff members. It provided a platform for students engaged in diverse research projects to showcase their research outcomes. Our dynamic President, **Ruth J. Simmons**, gave the opening remarks and stressed the importance of undergraduate research. Executive Director and Dean, **Tamara D. Brown** of the College of Juvenile, Justice and Psychology; Vice President, **Cajetan M. Akujuobi**, the Office of Research, Innovation and Sponsored Programs; and Former Provost and Senior Vice President **Felecia Nave** of Academic Affairs, were present and provided remarks. Each pointed out that undergraduate research is important and beneficial to PVAMU's plan of emerging as a "Research Institution". Thirty five (35) faculty/staff, 181 undergraduates, 5 graduates, and 4 invited guests participated in the information session. The topics presented by speakers at the event were as follows:
