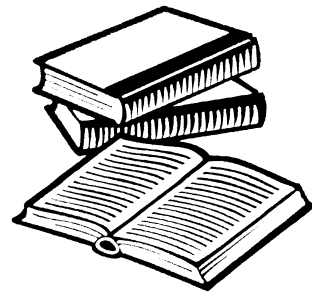
AACN ON SOCIAL MEDIA USE

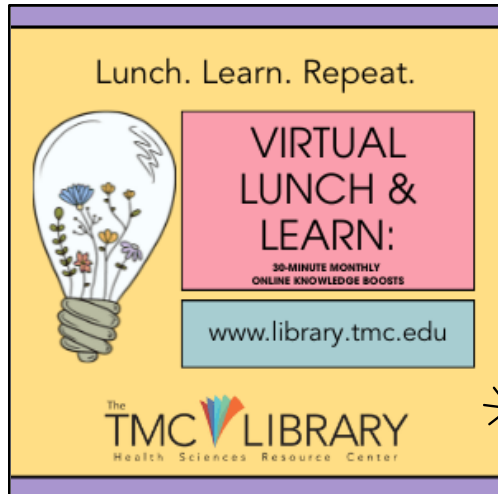

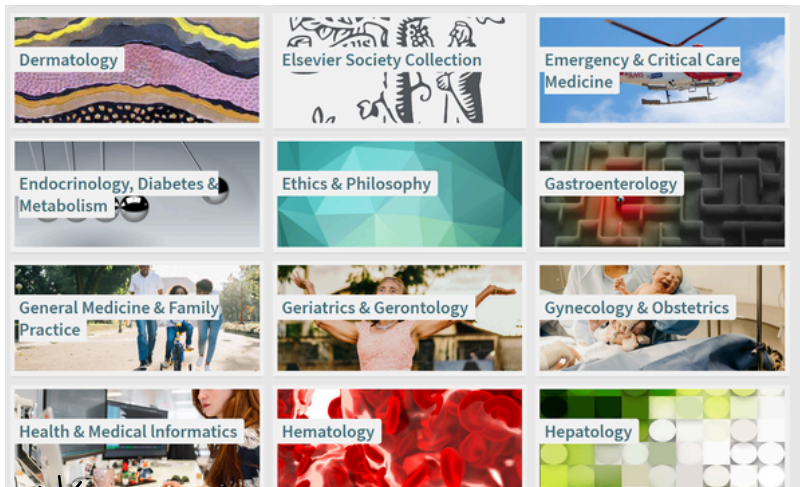

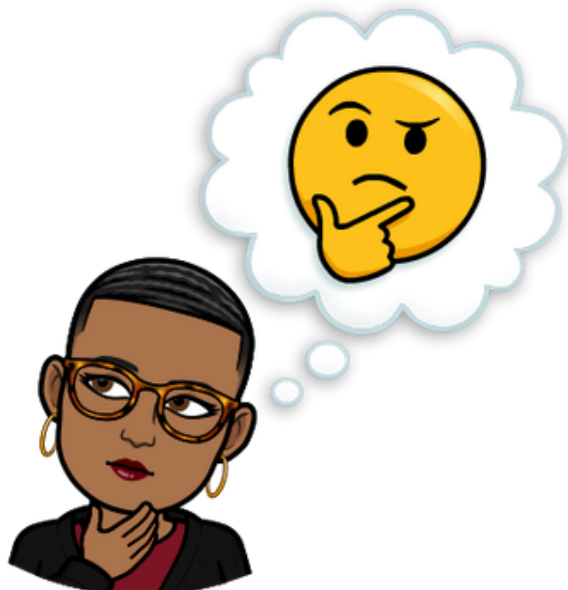
