Serves as the primary POC for prevention activities and coordinates or assist Program Manager (PM) with promoting the Army's "I A.M. Strong" SHARP Campaign and the Annual Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM) campaign. Coordinates and participates in prevention working groups and works with internal and external community leaders on prevention events and communication plans. Provides talking points to senior staff for town hall meetings and community information forums. Assists the PM in conducting command inspections and staff assistance visits and provides feedback to senior commanders. Publishes SHARP operations orders. Provides rationales for funding for training aid and resources, external/contractor training lectures for all unites on the installation.
- Company Commander for Charlie Company, 551st Signal Battalion, the Signal Regiment's Advanced Individual Training Company for the Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) Nodal Network Systems Operators (25N) and overflow for the MOS Information Technology Specialist (25B); Develop and lead 19 cadre members ranging from Staff Sergeant to First Lieutenant and 6 platoons with an average assigned strength of approximately 450 Trainees; oversee Command Supply Discipline Program (CSDP) for approximately \$187,300 worth of equipment within assigned barracks.
